## Mauldin Police Arrest Lancaster Man In Internet Predator Sting

**Columbia, S.C.** – Attorney General Henry McMaster announced today that Floyd Wayne Daniels, 40, of 528 Creekside Park Lane in Lancaster, South Carolina, was arrested on February 22, 2010, in an Internet Predator sting conducted by the City of Mauldin Police Department.

The City of Mauldin Police Department is a member of the Attorney General's Internet Crimes Against Children (ICAC) Task Force.

Daniels was arrested on one (1) count of Criminal Solicitation of a Minor (§16-15-342), a felony offense punishable to ten (10) years imprisonment.

An arrest warrant alleges that beginning October 29, 2009, Daniels solicited sex on the Internet from an individual he believed to be a minor girl. In reality, he was soliciting sex from an undercover Mauldin Police officer.

Daniels was assigned a bond of \$20,000. [A booking photo is available through the Greenville County Detention Center.](#)

A search warrant executed at Daniels' residence resulted in the seizure of a computer, monitor, and webcam. The Lancaster County Sheriff's Office assisted in the case.

This is the one hundred eighty-sixth (186<sup>th</sup>) arrest for the Task Force.

The case will be prosecuted by the Attorney General's Office.

McMaster stressed that all defendants are presumed innocent unless and until they are proven guilty in a court of law.
