Dear Mr. Flint:

I am in receipt of the letter you wrote concerning the recent election in Ware Shoals and the effect upon this election of the statute governing what constitutes a majority vote. You have stated that all persons received a majority vote. South Carolina Code of Laws, 1962, as amended, Section 23-496.1 which is the statute governing what constitutes a majority vote provides that when more candidates obtain a majority than there are positions to be filled, those having the highest vote (equal to the positions to be filled) shall be declared the nominees.

Therefore, I believe this part of the statute presents an answer to the questions you raised concerning this act.
