- 1. No portion of our staff is specifically assigned to monitor non-profit corporations. Attorneys are assigned to handle complaints or inquiries on such organizations when the activities thereof fall within the attorneys' special area of expertise.
- 2. The Attorney General is the Chief prosecuting officer of the State. The staff acts on its own initiative and discretion but complaints from the public are generally the source of investigation.
