Dear Ms. Moore:

Your letter concerning the obtaining of a masseuse license has been referred to me for answer by Attorney General McLeod. At this time, the State of South Carolina has no statute regarding the license of an individual to work as a masseur or a masseuse. There is, however, a case pending in Federal District Court concerning the constitutionality of a statute which has been enacted by the General Assembly which would regulate the licensing of massage parlors. In that the Federal Court has enjoined enforcement of this statute, there are no laws governing 'massage parlors' per se. If you have any further questions, please do not hesitate to contact this Office.
