Dear Mr. Washington:

Pursuant to the request of you and Mr. Francis K. Sullivan, we have checked the statutes year by year since the incorporation of the Town of Adamia which was incorporated by an act enacted December 6, 1852, and do not find any changes in any future statutes relating to the town. I do not know how the name was changed from Adamia to Adams Run but the charter of incorporation, a copy of which is enclosed, recites that the Village of Adams Run was declared to be a body politic and corporate by the name of Village of Adamia. I presume that they merely continued to use the original name. The records in the Office of the Secretary of State show that Adamia is followed by the note 'Adams Run,' indicating that the names are synonymous. They have no record of a change of name.

The town is carried in that office on the inactive list. I would assume that the charter is still valid but the town would have to be reorganized under present law.
