Dear Mr. Ames:

Currently the State of South Carolina selects its contractors by the competitive bid procedure set forth in Section 1-466, CODE OF LAWS OF SOUTH CAROLINA (1962), a copy of which is enclosed. There is, however, a bill pending in the Legislature which greatly expands the State's selection procedure, a copy of which is also enclosed. Architects are selected pursuant to Sections 1-453, et seq., CODE OF LAWS OF SOUTH CAROLINA (Cum. Supp.).

We have problems with Section 1-466 because it does not allow the State sufficient leeway in screening out contractors who are on financially shakey ground and we have had problems with contractors going into bankruptcy. The selection procedure with architectures and engineers has proved quite satisfactory.
