At a session of the State Grand Jury of South Carolina, convened in Columbia, South Carolina on April 19, 2018, the State Grand Jurors present upon their oath:

COUNT ONE
CONSPIRACY
S.C. Code Ann. §16-17-410

That DAVANTA TERRANCE JOHNSON (A/K/A "CHEDDAR"), TYREE DAYQUAN GEIGER, and NASIIR ALI SHAHEED DANIELS did in Newberry County on or about April 8, 2016 unlawfully, willfully, and knowingly unite, combine conspire, confederate, agree and have tacit understanding with one or more persons for the purpose of breaking into and stealing a motor vehicle, all in violation of Section 16-17-410 of the South Carolina Code of Laws (1976), as amended, such conduct arising out of and involving a criminal gang and a pattern of criminal gang activity.

COUNT TWO
BREAKING INTO A MOTOR VEHICLE
S.C. Code Ann. §16-13-160

That DAVANTA TERRANCE JOHNSON (A/K/A "CHEDDAR"), TYREE DAYQUAN GEIGER, and NASIIR ALI SHAHEED DANIELS did in Newberry County on or about April 8, 2016 unlawfully break into a motor vehicle, to wit: a white 2007 Chevrolet Impala, with the intent to steal the same or anything of value therefrom in violation of Section 16-13-160 of the South Carolina Code of Laws (1976), as amended, such conduct arising out of and involving a criminal gang and a pattern of criminal gang activity.

COUNT THREE
GRAND LARCENY (\$2,000 - \$10,000)
S.C. Code Ann. §16-13-30(B)


That DAVANTA TERRANCE JOHNSON (A/K/A "CHEDDAR"), TYREE DAYQUAN GEIGER, and NASIIR ALI SHAHEED DANIELS did in Newberry County on or about April 8, 2016 unlawfully take and carry away the goods, chattels, instruments, or other personalty of another, valued at more than Two Thousand Dollars, but less than Ten Thousand Dollars, with the intent to deprive the owner permanently of such property in violation of Section 16-13-30(B) of the South Carolina Code of Laws (1976), as amended, such conduct arising out of and involving a criminal gang and a pattern of criminal gang activity.

Against the peace and dignity of the State and contrary to the statute in such case made and provided.
