Dear Mr. Mills:

You have inquired as to the maximum payable accumulated annual leave any employee, who is retiring as of June 30, 1972, could have to his credit.

Under provisions of Section 1-85, 1962 Code of Laws of South Carolina, as amended, prior to the enactment of Act R-1531, 1972, effective June 2, 1972, the maximum terminal leave that could have accrued to anyone at 1971 year's end would have been 24 days. Thereafter, until June 2, 1972, maximum leave earned would have been 10 days—2 days per month. During June 1972, leave earned under R-1531 would be 2 ½ days. Thus, the maximum payable annual leave to anyone's credit, with maximum service, would be 36 ½ days.
