Dear Mr. Boulware:

An opinion of this office to you dated February 4, 2003 dealt with the authority of law enforcement officers to respond to a distress call. Following up on such, you have asked whether an off-duty officer responding to a distress call must respond in uniform and drive a marked vehicle.

Please be advised that I am unaware of any State statutory provisions responsive to your question. In the referenced opinion this office indicated that pursuant to S.C. Code Ann. Section 17-13-45 (2003) a law enforcement officer would be authorized to respond to a distress call from an adjacent jurisdiction. In such circumstances, it is my opinion that a regular law enforcement officer would not have to be in his law enforcement uniform or his marked automobile in order to respond. I am unaware of any restrictions indicating that such regular law enforcement officers must be clothed in his uniform or riding in a regularly marked law enforcement vehicle in order to have law enforcement authority. Compare: S.C. Code Ann. Section 23-6-100 (Members of the Highway Patrol "shall at all times, when in the performance of their duties, wear complete uniforms..."; Section 23-28-100 (Reserve police officers "...shall wear uniforms which will identify them as law enforcement officers."; Section 23-6-220 (Department of Public Safety Special Constables "...assisting a full time department law enforcement officer shall wear uniforms or other insignia which identify the constable..."; Section 50-3-130 (Officers of the Natural Resources Enforcement Division are

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to be provided a unique and distinctive official uniform "...to be worn by ...(them)...when on duty....").
