Dear Representative Young:

In a letter to this Office you questioned the status of the law on physician-related suicides in this State.

I am unaware of any State statutes or case law in this State that directly comments on the issue of physician-related suicides. The only provision with which I am familiar that may be relevant in examining such issue is Section 44-77-110 of the Code, a provision of this State's Death With Dignity Act, which states

> The execution and consummation of declarations made in accordance with Sections 44-77-40 and 44-77-50 ... (the Death With Dignity Act) ... do not constitute suicide for any purpose.

The referenced Act provides for the withholding of life sustaining procedures in the circumstances provided.
