Dear Mr. Young:

I am in receipt of your letter regarding filing fees. You have asked the following question:

> Does South Carolina law require a provision in the municipal statute for indigents in regard to a filing fee statute?

The United States Supreme Court in the case of <u>Lubin v. Panish</u>, 415 U.S. 709 (1974) held that if there was a filing fee required to be paid to run for an Office, then there has to be an alternate procedure for indigents to be placed on the ballot. I am enclosing a prior opinion of this Office that might be of further assistance to you regarding your general question.
