Dear Senator Reese:

In a letter to this Office you questioned whether a county is required to pay a part-time magistrate for a minimum of ten hours a week. Pursuant to Section 22-8-10(3) of the Code a part-time magistrate is defined as a magistrate who regularly works less than forty hours a week performing official duties.

A prior opinion of this Office dated February 16, 1989 dealt with the question of whether a county is limited to establishing 10-hour work weeks for part-time magistrates or may it establish work weeks of any length up to forty The opinion concluded that counties are not limited to establishing 10-hour work weeks for part-time magistrates and that part-time magistrates may work any period as long as it is less than forty hours a week. The opinion noted that pursuant to Section 22-8-40(D) a part-time magistrate is entitled to a proportionate percentage of the salary provided full-time magistrates with the percentage being computed by dividing by forty the number of hours the partmagistrate performs his duties. Therefore, a county is not required to pay a part-time magistrate for a minimum ten hours a week but instead only for those hours worked which, of course, may not exceed thirty-nine hours in a week.
