Dear Representative Chamblee:

As you were advised by Attorney General Medlock, your letter of March 29, 1991, with enclosure from one of your constituents, was referred to me for research and response. Your constituent is concerned about perpetual care cemeteries charging fees for their care and maintenance funds higher than state law allows.

This Office issued an exhaustive opinion on February 26, 1987, concerning the various issues about which your constituent is concerned. State law provides that a minimum of eight cents per square inch (of the memorial's or the marker's base) be placed in a perpetual care cemetery's care and maintenance trust fund. § 39-55-155, S.C. Code Ann. (1976). Other than that statute, we are unable to locate any which otherwise regulates the specific fees which may be charged by a cemetery. A copy of the previous opinion is enclosed.

We have reviewed the law and statutes discussed in the previous-ly-issued opinion and have found that the prior opinion still represents the law as is currently in effect. There is thus no reason to revisit the conclusions reached therein. The opinion of February 26, 1987 is therefore still the opinion of this Office as to those issues.

As noted in the prior opinion, this Office cannot investigate facts, nor can we determine conclusively that tying arrangements or violations of the Sherman Antitrust Act or the Clayton Act have occurred. We continue to suggest that the judicial system or the Cemetery Board would be more appropriate for ain which your constituent's concerns could be resolved.
