Dear Mr. King:

You have requested the advice of this office as to whether two witnesses are required for the affidavit filed under the authority of Section 33-42-300 of the Code of Laws of South Carolina 1976, as amended. See Act 491, Acts and Joint Resolutions of South Carolina, 1984 page 2075. This affidavit contains information concerning a limited partnership and must be filed prior to selling, conveying or transferring an interest in property owned by a limited partnership.

Section 27-7-10 of the Code requires two or more witnesses to conveyances of land or real estate in fee simple. The affidavit in question is not such a conveyance in that it merely states information concerning the limited partnership. Therefore, Section 27-7-10 would not require two witnesses to the affidavit. Recording of an affidavit can be accomplished by compliance with the requirements of Section 30-5-30 of the Code.
