Dear Mr. Wilson:

By your letter of March 5, 1986, you have requested the opinion of this Office as to whether an individual convicted of a felony in the United States District Court may file as a candidate for the office of school board trustee. You have further advised that the individual has filed an appeal from the conviction. This Office has issued numerous opinions dispositive of the issues raised by your question; the following opinions are enclosed herewith:

- 1. Opinion No. 84-94, as to conviction of a felony in federal court and disenfranchisement.
- 2. Opinion No. 1940, dated November 8, 1965, as to an appeal from a conviction not staying disqualification to serve as a public officer.
- 3. Opinions dated August 27, 1968; August 13, 1959; April 17, 1968; October 31, 1974; and June 12, 1974 as to inclusion of one unqualified to hold a public office on the ballot for that office.

The following cases are consistent with the foregoing opinions listed in number 3: Ravenel v. Dekle, 265 S.C. 364, 218 S.E.2d 521 (1975) (enclosed); Comer v.
