Dear Representative Cobb:

You have asked for an opinion from this office as to the procedure for a special purpose district to dispose of property. There is no specific law governing the sale of property by a special purpose district.

Generally, the sale of property by a public entity must be made in such manner and upon such terms as would be most advantageous to the public. The sale of state property that is not in actual public use may be made either by public auction or by competitive sealed bid to the highest bidder. § 11–35–3820, Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1976 (as amended) Either of these procedures would be proper for the sale of such property by a special purpose district.
