Dear Earle:

In connection with the application which you may receive for terminal leave from constitutional officers, I advise that the opinion written by Mr. Coleman on June 11, 1976, was superseded by an opinion dated October 5, 1976, and prepared by Stephen T. Savitz, Assistant Attorney General. I wrote to Mr. Ralph Magoffin, Deputy Commissioner, S. C. Department of Agriculture, on October 5, 1976, and incorporating and sending to him a copy of the memo from Mr. Savitz. I advised him that elected officers were not entitled to sick leave nor are they entitled to terminal leave.

This information was recently given to Mr. Bryan Patrick, who is leaving the office of Agriculture Commissioner, and he will not apply for nor receive terminal leave; nor will I apply for or receive terminal leave on my departure from office.
