Dear Mr. Andrews:

You have requested an opinion as to whether a Georgia professional corporation which is engaged in the profession of architecture may incorporate in South Carolina as a foreign corporation under § 33-23-20, South Carolina Code of Laws of 1976. While it appears that this is not a permissible approach for persons engaged in the practice of medicine (see opinion of this Office dated November 25, 1977), § 40-3-100 explicitly states that a corporation or partnership may practice architecture in this state. It is accordingly the opinion of this Office that a Georgia professional corporation engaged in architecture may incorporate in South Carolina pursuant to § 33-23-20. Sincerely yours,
