Dear Colonel Pechilis:

You have requested an opinion whether the South Carolina Auctioneers' Commission may issue an auctioneer's license or an apprentice auctioneer license to a person who is not a resident of South Carolina. It is the opinion of this office that the Commission may issue a license to a nonresident only pursuant to the reciprocal licensing provision of the licensing statute set out at § 40-6-130, Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1976 (as amended).

The Code sets out the general requirements for licenses in this State at § 40-6-60, <u>Id.</u> It provides that 'no person shall be licensed . . . unless he is . . . a resident of this State.' There is a general exception to this requirement set out at § 40-6-130, <u>Id.</u> It provides that 'any person who holds a valid auctioneer's license in another state may apply for and be granted a South Carolina license if the state in which he is licensed provides similar recognition to a license granted by this State.' This section does not include a provision for offering an apprentice auctioneer license by reciprocity, but rather only an auctioneer license. § 40-6-130, Id.

Therefore, it is the opinion of this Office that the Auctioneers' Commission may offer an auctioneer license by reciprocity to a nonresident. However, it may not issue an auctioneer license to a nonresident other than by reciprocity. In addition it may not issue an apprentice auctioneer license to a non-resident. Sincerely yours,
