Dear Mr. Sullivan:

On behalf of Representative D. N. Holt, Jr., you have requested the opinion of this office as to whether a member of one of the constituent school boards of trustees for the Charleston County School District may continue to serve in that position if he is elected to a city council. Our previous opinions concerning positions on city councils and boards of school trustees make clear that a person's simultaneously serving in both of those capacities would constitute dual office-holding in violation of Articles VI § 3 and XVII § 1A of the Constitution of South Carolina (1895). See 1976 Ops. Atty Gen., No's. 4293 and 4490.
