Dear Mr. Brunson:

I am in receipt of your recent letter. You have stated that York County has two precincts that in certain school elections have only a few eligible people who vote in those precincts. You have inquired if I know of any procedure whereby you could somehow not have to activate those precincts during the school elections.

I agree with your conclusion that there is no alternative but to have the precincts open on the day of the election even if only a few persons will be voting in those precincts. South Carolina Code of Laws, 1976, Sections 7-7-910; 7-7-930; South Carolina Constitution, Article II, Section 4.
