Dear Mr. Timmons:

This letter is to confirm my telephone conversation of today with Ms. Nelle Power, Administrator of the Greenville County Election Commission. Ms. Power has requested information as to whether or not a space should be placed on the school district election ballot for a write-in vote. South Carolina Code of Laws, 1976, Section 7-13-360 requires a ballot to contain a place for the voters to write-in the name of any person they wish to vote for. Unless there is a specific provision which exempts a school district election in Greenville County from complying with this provision, a place should be placed on the ballot for a write-in vote.
