Dear Representative Martin:

You have requested an opinion from this Office as to the requirements of Section 4-9-30(5), CODE OF LAWS OF SOUTH CAROLINA, 1976, as amended. In my opinion, irrespective of the method used to create a special tax district thereunder, a referendum must be held before taxes can be levied and general obligation boards issued. The same referendum can present the issues of the creation of the special tax district, the services which it is to provide, the maximum level of taxes to be imposed and the amount of general obligation bonds, if any, to be issued.
