Dear Magistrate Lenoir:

In our telephone conversation yesterday you asked for a written response from this Office as to whether an individual could be cited for a violation of [Section 56-5-1210](#) and [56-5-1230](#), [Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1976](#), as to the situation you described. As I informed you, an individual may under the proper circumstances be charged with violating [Section 56-5-1210](#), but it would not be proper to cite for a violation of [Section 56-5-1230](#) inasmuch as the latter statute is merely supplemental to [Section 56-5-1210](#) and does not provide an additional statutory offense for which an individual may be charged.
