Dear Mr. Riley:

In response to your request for an opinion from this Office as to whether or not the provisions of [Sections 4-29-10 et seq., CODE OF LAWS OF SOUTH CAROLINA](#), 1976, as amended (the Industrial Revenue Bond Act), include a project that fabricates, assembles and distributes products to local manufacturing concerns, primarily textile, my opinion is that such a project comes within the scope of the aforementioned Act. [Section 4-29-10\(3\)](#) expressly includes within the definition of 'project,' . . . machinery, apparatus, equipment, . . . deemed necessary, suitable or useful by . . . (a) any enterprise for the manufacturing, processing, or assembling of any . . . manufactured products; (b) any commercial enterprise engaged in . . . distributing . . . products of . . . industry, . . .
