Dear Mr. Byars:

You have requested an opinion from this office as to whether an Assistant Solicitor who is also a City Recorder violates the dual office-holding provision of the South Carolina Constitution. Article VI, Section 3 of the South Carolina Constitution provides that 'No person shall hold two offices of honor or profit at the same time . . . '

It has previously been the opinion of this office that the positions of Assistant Solicitor and City Recorder are 'offices' under the meaning of Article VI, Section 3; See Op. Att'y. Gen. June 19, 1975; Op. Att'y. Gen. June 20, 1973; Op. Att'y. Gen. May 5, 1977; and 1956 Op. Att'y. Gen. 100; attached herewith. Accordingly, it is the opinion of this office that a person could not concurrently hold positions as Assistant Solicitor and City Recorder without being in violation of the South Carolina Constitution.
