Dear Mr. Wilkie:

In response to your request for an opinion as to whether or not a medically retired pharmacist is qualified to be a candidate for membership on the State Board of Pharmaceutical Examiners, Section 56–1301, CODE OF LAWS OF SOUTH CAROLINA, 1962, as amended (Cum. Supp.) provides in part as follows:

The Board of Pharmaceutical Examiners of the State shall consist of seven pharmacists doing business within this State. . . .

Inasmuch as a pharmacist must be 'doing business' in order to be qualified to be a member of the Board of Pharmaceutical Examiners, my opinion is that a retired pharmacist who, clearly, is not 'doing business' is not so qualified.
