## **QUESTION:**

Is Friday a legislative day for social security purposes?

## **CITATIONS:**

Article III, Section 9 Constitution of South Carolina; Opinion No. 1667, Opinion of the Attorney General, 1964; Rule 6.1, Rules of the House of Representatives.

## **DISCUSSION:**

A question has been raised as to whether or not Friday counts as a legislative day for social security purposes. It is the opinion of this Office that Friday is a legislative day. Article III, Section 9 of the Constitution of South Carolina provides: Members of the General Assembly shall not receive any compensation for more than forty days of any one session; . . ..

Furthermore, Rule 6.1 of the House of Representatives provides:

The House shall meet each legislative day at 12:00 noon every Tuesday, 11:00 A. M. every Wednesday and 10:00 A. M. every Thursday and Friday, unless otherwise ordered by the House.

The House is bound by its own rules, and unless, the House votes not to meet on Friday, Friday is a legislative day. <u>See</u>: enclosed opinion. Therefore, each Friday during the first forty days of the legislative session is a legislative day.
