Dear Sir:

Your letter of April 19, 1977, was referred by Attorney General McLeod to me for answer. I apologize for the delay in answer, however, your letter was inadvertently misplaced. Your question concerns the interpretation of Section 64–2 of the South Carolina Code of Laws. Specifically, you asked whether or not a grocery store which also operates a delicatessen within the store without walls or partitions to separate the grocery and delicatessen areas is in violation of South Carolina's Blue Laws if the delicatessen and grocery store as a combination hire more than three people on Sunday. This Office has consistently opined that a grocery store may only have three people working in it on Sunday whether or not they also run a food establishment. The fact that the grocery store has a delicatessen in it does not, in the opinion of this Office, allow grocery stores to have more than three employees under the roof of the store.
