Dear Mr. Kirkland:

Your request for an opinion on dual office holding has been referred to me for reply. You have asked whether a person who occupies an office as a member of the Allendale County Board of Directors may also serve as a member of the Western Carolina Higher Education Commission without violating the dual office holding prohibition of the State Constitution.

Enclosed is an opinion written by Assistant Attorney General George Beighley which rules that membership on the Georgetown County Commission for Higher Education constitutes an office. An examination of the powers of that Commission and the powers of the Western Carolina Higher Education Commission enumerated in Code of Laws of South Carolina, Section 21-721 (1962) reveals that the powers are the same. Therefore, one person cannot hold both of these offices without violating the dual office holding prohibition of the State Constitution.
