Dear Mr. Miller:

You have requested an opinion from this Office as to whether or not the Spartanburg City Council can enact an ordinance providing for the payment of travel and lodging expenses for the spouses of city council members. In my opinion, it is not so authorized.

Section 5-7-170, CODE OF LAWS OF SOUTH CAROLINA, 1976, provides in part as follows:

... The mayor and councilmen may also receive payment for <u>actual expenses incurred in the performance of their official duties</u> within limitations prescribed by ordinance. [Emphasis added.]

This language quite clearly limits reimbursement for expenses to those actually incurred by the mayor and council members in the performance of their official duties and, therefore, does not include expenses incurred by the spouses of those officials.

In response to your other inquiries, a per diem reimbursement would not be allowed since the statute authorizes repayment for <u>actual</u> expenses only. As far as itemization of expenses is concerned, I think that any itemization which discloses the actual expenses incurred (<u>e.g.</u>, itemizations such as lodging, travel, seminar fees, books, etc.) would be appropriate.
