## Dear Mr. Jones:

You have requested an opinion from this Office as to the validity of an act of the 1977 South Carolina General Assembly (R280) which amends a 1971 act creating the Jasper County Hospital Commission. Inasmuch as the 1977 legislation has been enacted, our Office must presume the constitutionality of it until and unless a court of competent jurisdiction declares otherwise. If, however, an action were brought pursuant to the Uniform Declaratory Judgments Act [§§ 15-53-10 et seq., CODE OF LAWS OF SOUTH CAROLINA, 1976], in my opinion, the 1977 legislation would be declared unconstitutional as violative of Article VIII, Section 7 of the South Carolina Constitution of 1895, as amended, which prohibits the enactment of laws for a specific county. See, e.g., Knight v. Salisbury, 206 S.E.2d 875 (1974). With kind regards,
