Dear Chief Schultz:

Your recent letter to Attorney General McLeod concerning dual office holding has been referred to me for reply. You have asked if the same individual may serve as a State Constable (paid) and a Municipal Recorder at the same time.

I am enclosing two (2) prior Opinions of this Office, Opinion No. 4029, dated May 13, 1975, and Opinion No. 3778, dated May 14, 1974. You will note from these Opinions that this Office has previously determined that both the position of Municipal Recorder and State Constable constitute offices in the constitutional sense. Therefore, the same individual could not simultaneously serve as a State Constable and a Municipal Recorder, without violating the State's constitutional restrictions on dual office holding.
