Dear Mr. Commissioner:

You have requested that we advise you as to whether or not the Department of Labor may pay former employees a witness fee for their attendance at contested administrative hearings conducted by the department.

The right of a witness to compensation is entirely statutory. 81 Am.Jur.2d <u>Witnesses</u>, § 23 at 47. Witness fees were not paid at common law. 97 C.J.S. <u>Witnesses</u>, § 35 at 421. Because our research does not reveal any statute authorizing the payment of witness fees, the Department may not compensate those who attend its administrative hearings as witnesses. <u>Cf. e.g.</u>, Code of Laws of South Carolina § 41-15-270 (1976); <u>Id.</u> § 1-23-320, (Cumm.Supp.).
