## Dear Governor Riley:

In response to your request for an opinion from this Office regarding the constitutionality of an act of the General Assembly amending Section 12-37-220 of the 1976 South Carolina Code of Laws so as to provide that, in Spartanburg County only, all self-propelled farm machinery and equipment is exempt from ad valorem taxation, my opinion is that such legislation violates Article X, Section 3 of the South Carolina Constitution which empowers the General Assembly to provide for exemptions from the property tax by 'general laws applicable uniformly to property throughout the State and in all political subdivisions.' S.C. CONST. art. X, § 3. In addition, the legislation is most probably violative of the 'no laws for a specific county' language of Article VIII, Section 7 of the State Constitution.
