### \*1 SUBJECT: Municipal Corporations, Public Officers

Occupation of the offices of city attorney and municipal judge by the same individual would violate Constitutional restrictions against dual office holding.

## **QUESTION PRESENTED:**

Would the holding of the position of city attorney and municipal judge by the same individual violate Constitutional restrictions against dual office holding?

# **AUTHORITIES**:

South Carolina Constitution, Article XVII, Section 1A;

Section 5–7–230, Code of Laws of South Carolina (1976);

1974–75 Ops. Atty. Gen., No. 4173; and

1977 Ops.Atty.Gen., No. 77-137.

### DISCUSSION:

The South Carolina Constitution, Article XVII, Section 1A, prohibits she holding of two offices for honor or profit at the same time. It has previously been the opinion of this office that the position of part-time municipal judge constitutes an office in the Constitutional sense, and that the acceptance of a second office would violate the Constitutional restrictions on dual office holding. 1974–75 Ops.Atty.Gen., No. 4173, p. 230. It has also been the opinion of this office in the past that Section 5–7–230 of the Code of Laws of South Carolina (1976), makes the position of municipal attorney an office subject to Constitutional restrictions on dual office holding. 1977 Ops.Atty.Gen., No. 77–137, p. 114.

### CONCLUSION:

The holding of the offices of city attorney and municipal judge by the same individual would violate State Constitutional restrictions set forth in Article XVII, Section 1A, against dual office holding.
