Dear Representative Gordon:

This letter is to confirm our telephone conversation of today. You have asked the following questions: (1) Can a person vote in a precinct other than the one in which he lives?

No. Pursuant to Sections 7-7-910 and 7-7-930 of the Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1976, a person must vote in the precinct in which he lives.

(2) Pursuant to statute, the General Assembly has re-precincted Williamsburg County. May a person refuse to vote in his new precinct and continue to vote in his old precinct?

No. As stated before a person must vote in the precinct in which he resides. He would not have the discretion to vote in a precinct other than the one in which he resides. Very truly yours,
