Dear Mr. King:

Attorney General Daniel R. McLeod has referred to me your letter concerning the nuisance in your neighborhood.

The provisions of § 16-558 1962 Code of Laws, as amended, prohibit disorderly or boisterous conduct on any highway or at any public place. If you think this statute has been violated and can determine who has in fact violated it, you would certainly be entitled to present this to the magistrate having jurisdiction. If the magistrate determines that there is probable cause to believe these people have violated the statute then it is most likely he would issue a warrant for their arrest.

You may wish to consult a private attorney to see if you might have any recourse in the civil courts.
