I regret very much to advise you that this Office cannot render an official opinion on the validity of the marriage set forth in your letter.

I am enclosing a copy of Summary of South Carolina Marriage Laws and call your particular attention to pages 1 and 4 thereof as they would have some application to the facts set forth in your letter. Additionally, while our case law would seem to uphold the validity of the marriage set forth in your letter, there is still a concept that the parties' relationship had ripened into a common law marriage, which is recognized in South Carolina.
