***1 Re: Pay for School Teachers during National Guard Training**

Dear Mr. Busbee:

In reply to your letter of May 22, 1975, please be advised that Sections 44-168 and 44-861, South Carolina Code of Laws (1962), as amended, provide that all employees of this State or any political subdivision are entitled to leaves of absence from their respective duties while attending their annual National Guard training without loss of pay. Therefore, it would appear that a school teacher would be entitled to his teacher's salary, even though he receives pay from the National Guard and even though the school District is required to pay for his substitute.
