## Dear Mr. Sandifer:

You have requested an opinion from the Office as to whether or not Oconee County can build and support a county animal shelter. It is the opinion of this Office that Oconee County does have statutory authority to build and support such a shelter.

Oconee County operates under the County Council form of government. 57 STAT. 1047 (1971), 58 STAT. 4 (1973). Pursuant to Section 8(8), 57 STAT. 1047 at 1050, the Oconee Council has the authority 'to provide within the county special services which are considered necessary to public health, welfare, and safety, . . ..' As of January 1, 1975, all duties of the Oconee County Board of Commissioners devolved upon the County Council. 58 STAT. 4.

Pursuant to Article 10, § 6 of the Constitution of South Carolina, 'quarantine' is one of the purposes for which the Legislature can authorize a county to levy a tax. By authorizing the County Council to offer services necessary to protect public health, welfare and safety, the Legislature has authorized Oconee County to provide for the public health through quarantine of animals, which is the essential function of an animal shelter.
