Dear Judge Finley:

You have inquired whether or not a person who alleges he was hunting snakes along a highway is excepted from the State's pistol law [Section 16-129, et seq.] under provisions of Section 16-129.1(4) when he has a pistol on or about his person in an automobile on the highway and is in possession of a valid hunting license.

It is the opinion of this Office that the word 'hunting' as used in Section 16-129.1(4) means pursuit of game birds or animals in generally recognized hunting places, and that the subject exception does not contemplate hunting snakes along the highway.
