Dear Mr. Rawl:

Your letter of recent date to the Attorney General requesting information regarding the disposal of certain records presently being kept by the Lexington County Department of Education was forwarded to me for reply.

Act No. 291 of 1973, 58 STAT. AT LARGE, p. 350, subsequently codified as sections 1-581 through 1-594 of the CODE OF LAWS OF SOUTH CAROLINA, 1962, as amended, deals with the disposition of all public records.

For the purposes of your inquiry, Act No. 291 of 1973 essentially states that when requested, the South Carolina Department of Archives and History will work with a public agency to establish a schedule for the retention and destruction of the records of that agency.

I suggest you advise Mr. Harmon of the availability of this service and recommend that he contact Mr. Julian Mimms, Assistant Director of Local Records, South Carolina Department of Archives and History, 1430 Senate Street, Post Office Box 11669, Columbia, South Carolina 29211.
