Dear Mr. Coleman:

Thank you for your letter of January 16, 1974, concerning whether or not the code sections requiring pupils entering public school to have a physical and dental examinations are still in effect.

South Carolina Code of Laws, 1962, Sections 21-753 to 21-755 were repealed in 1972 by Act No. 1312. Section 21-753 was the statute specifically requiring these physical examinations; Section 21-754 made the results of these examinations confidential; and, Section 21-755 provided a penalty for a parent refusing to allow the examination. Section 21-752 establishes the lawful age for attendance in public schools and this section is still in effect. Sincerely,
