Enclosed you will find a memorandum prepared by one of our law clerks concerning the application of two statutes that relate to the employment of relatives of school trustees. As you will note, he concludes that there is no statutory prohibition which would prevent a relative of a school trustee from being employed in a non-teaching position, and a sister-in-law of a school trustee could not be employed as a teacher without the approval of the county board of education or a majority of the parents or guardians of children attending the school where the teacher is to be employed.
