### In Re: Free Tuition for Dependents of Faculty Members

Honorable John E. Wise Vice President and Treasurer Medical University of South Carolina

# Dear Mr. Wise:

You have inquired whether or not the Medical University is authorized to waive tuition requirements for the children or other dependents of faculty members.

Until 1964, under Section 22–104[9], the University of South Carolina was authorized to exempt from tuition fees the children of full time faculty members. This provision was repealed in 1964.

In the absence of specific statutory authority therefor, the Medical University is not authorized to waive tuition fee requirements for anyone. I have been unable to find any statutory authority for such waiver. Yours very truly,
