Dear Mr. West:

Your letter of May 24, 1974, to Mr. James B. Ellisor, has been referred to this Office for reply. You have requested information as to the requirements of establishing a 'Commission of Registration' when that municipality has not enacted the Uniform Municipal Election Law.

I understand you to be referring to South Carolina Code of Laws, 1962, § 23-114 which requires that ninety days before an election the mayor or attendant shall appoint supervisors of registration. This section was repealed by implication when the State Elections Commission was created in 1968 and was authorized to perform the same functions previously exercised by the supervisors of registration. Therefore, these supervisors need not be appointed. Enclosed please find a more detailed letter written in 1269 which deals with this exact issue.
