Dear Mr. Singletary:

You have informed me that a special election is going to be held to fill the vacancy created by the resignation of Representative Morris and that the candidate is running unopposed. You have inquired whether or not it will be necessary to appoint three managers for each five hundred electors.

South Carolina Code of Laws, 1962, as amended, Section 23-400 requires that before every special or general election three to five commissioners of election shall be appointed and that they . . . shall appoint three managers of election for each polling place in the county for which they shall respectively be appointed for each five hundred electors, or portion thereof, registered to vote thereat . . .

Therefore, it would be necessary to appoint three managers for each five hundred electors.
