Dear Mrs. Hodge:

You have asked if corporal punishment of children in school is illegal. Corporal punishment of children is not considered child abuse in South Carolina. In fact, South Carolina Code of Laws, Section 21-776 (Supp. 1973) specifically states that the governing body of the school district may provide for such punishment. However, punishment must be reasonable; harsh or cruel punishment would not be allowed. 1956-57, Opin. Attorney General, 247.
