Dear Mr. Walters:

We are in receipt of your letter in which you inquire as to the effect of the House Reapportionment Act upon South Carolina Code of Laws, 1962, as amended, Section 30-203.1 which is a statute which establishes the criteria for a majority vote in a legislative delegation. The statute makes reference to Representatives resident in the county and, as you have pointed out, the Reapportionment Bill has redrawn the boundaries for House members in such a way that they do not correspond to county lines. Therefore, the Representatives needed to concur in a majority vote would be the Representatives actually living in the county. Sincerely,
